Wraparound Fundamentals

Care Coordinators and Service Facilitators

With the principles of wraparound as a foundation, care coordinators and services facilitators will learn how to develop a team and guide them through the wraparound process including completion of a strength-based assessment, consideration of underlying needs, development of an individualized plan of care including planning for crisis, and facilitation of transition out of the formal team process.

Wraparound Supervisors

Supervisors play a key role in helping staff accomplish the necessary activities of the wraparound process in programs such as CCS and CST. Providing supervision to wraparound staff requires specialized knowledge and skills. Core practices and tools will be identified that can assist supervisors in supporting their staff to implement wraparound to fidelity.

Team Members

Participants will learn the roles and responsibilities of wraparound team members in programs such as CST and CCS. Team members play an important role in the assessment, plan development, plan implementation, and transition planning processes.

Advanced Practice

Prerequisite: Wraparound fundamentals for Care Coordinators and Service Facilitators, or Wraparound Supervisors

Wraparound Assessment Process

In-depth look at the wraparound assessment process. Covers engagement skills including OARS, strengths and needs discovery, long-term/transition goal development, and crafting a narrative summary.

Planning Using the Wraparound Lens

Take a deep dive into crafting individualized plans of care that carry a team to successful transition/discharge from programs such as CCS and CST utilizing the "wraparound lens" of culture, strengths, long-term goals, support network, and underlying needs.

Engaging Youth and Family Members

Engagement of youth and family members in the wraparound process is essential to a positive team experience and the achievement of meaningful outcomes. Learn best practice strategies for effectively engaging youth and family members initially and keeping them engaged throughout the process, including matching the stage of treatment with a youth and family's stage of change.

Working Through the Unexpected

On wraparound teams, situations arise that may be seen as challenging or conflictual. This workshop explores ways to prevent the unexpected from happening, to address the unexpected when it does occur, and tips for responding to behaviors such as blaming, dominating, and silence.

Learning Collaboratives

Prerequisite: Wraparound fundamentals for Care Coordinators and Service Facilitators, or Wraparound Supervisors

Facilitated by wraparound trainers, learning collaboratives are peer forums for sharing and getting ideas related to areas of struggle, questions, and tools related to the role and responsibilities of a care coordinator/service facilitator. Discuss strategies for implementing specific wraparound skills in real situations with peers and workshop presenters.

Learning collaboratives are available for both care coordinators/service facilitators as well as for wraparound supervisors.

Other Events

Tribal Nation Forums

Wraparound events specific to Tribal nations including learning collaboratives, wraparound workshops, and annual in-person events.

CST Contract Advisory Meetings

Facilitated by WI DHS CST Contract Administrators, CST Contract Advisory Meetings are informational meetings for counties and Tribal nations who have contracts with the WI DHS to implement CST.

Wraparound Seminars

Seminars related to a topic of interest for individuals working with youth and families in programs utilizing the wraparound process. Coordinating committee members, system partners, individuals with lived experience, and natural and community supports are also welcome to attend.

CCS/CST Statewide Meeting

Annual event for CCS and CST staff who work within the Children's System of Care. Coordinating committee members, system partners, individuals with lived experience, and natural and community supports are also welcome to attend.
